Background The protein encoded by this gene is a type-1 membrane glycoprotein, which contains two

immunoglobulin domains, and thus belongs to the immunoglobulin superfamily. Studies of the related genes in mouse and rat suggest that this gene may regulate myeloid cell activity and delivers an inhibitory signal for the macrophage lineage in diverse tissues. Multiple alternatively spliced transcript variants that encode different isoforms have been found for this gene. [provided by RefSeq, Jul 2008]

Function Costimulates T-cell proliferation. May regulate myeloid cell activity in a variety of tissues. [UniProt]
